"Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind, and, 'Love your neighbour as yourself." What we call "Carmel" is really a way of life in which we strive to be aware of the presence of God in the most ordinary, everyday things. We're contemplative, but we live out our service in the world. We're prayerful, but we're also practical.

We were founded over 800 years ago on a mountaintop called Mount Carmel in Israel, but we have our feet firmly planted in today's problems and concerns. Carmelites live together in small communities so that we can support one another in our desire to live up to what God wants of us.

Carmelite friars are parish priests, teachers and spiritual directors, as well as social workers and chaplains. There is no one career that defines a Carmelite. We pray for the freedom to respond to needs wherever we find them.

In 2001 the Carmelites responded to a need in Timor-Leste taking responsibility for the Timor-Leste mission and the Parish of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, Zumalai. Twenty years on, our mission is now firmly established with a formation program, a parish in Zumalai, and a community development program.

Plea of a Timorese village elder, "If you're not here, there's nothing. The Carmelites are the light in our darkness, while you've been here our children have the possibility of an education. Our mothers, babies and community have medical help. If you're not here, there's nothing." The village elder saw it and he knew the impact The Carmelites could make to his people. The Carmelites made a commitment to that plea and Gifts in Wills are essential to delivering on this commitment.

Planning for the future

Writing a Will is one of the most important activities you will undertake during your lifetime. When you make a valid Will and keep it up to date, you ensure that your loved ones are provided for, and that your estate is divided according to your wishes. When making your Will, you also have the opportunity to include gifts to charitable causes that are close to your heart.



Making your Will should not be seen as a daunting legal task. Your solicitor or legal advisor can guide you smoothly through the process. Then, it is a matter of regularly reviewing your Will when your family or life circumstances change. Wills can be created online now, some free of charge.

This booklet offers a guide to realising your wishes. It also shares some stories about the impact on Carmelite ministries made possible by caring people like you. Your support of our programs has been inspirational.

Like the Good Samaritan, you have changed the lives of your neighbours – both at home and in Timor-Leste. You have provided life-changing opportunities. Just imagine what your legacy gift can one day achieve.

Large or small, it will have the power to create a future of possibilities for the people in our community. Whether it is training young men to become priests, and equipping them to become leaders of their communities, or providing young Timorese people with hope for a better future through education, your gift will sustain our work and transform lives.

The Carmelites have a tradition across eight centuries originating in the 1190s in the Holy Land. The story of The Carmelites in Australia began in 1802, more than 200 years ago.

The Carmelites in Australia

Since arriving in Australia, The Carmelites have been actively involved with Australian communities through parish ministry, schools, spirituality and retreat centres and a library offering pastoral and spiritual companionship to people.

The Carmelites in Fast Timor

Since 2001 The Carmelites have also been supporting the people of Timor-Leste both spiritually and through practical support assisting in the reconstruction of their communities. In 2019 Carmel Impact was formally established. This charity builds on the Carmelites' eight century legacy of serving humanity, and the last 20 years working with impoverished communities in Timor-Leste. Its goal is to transform lives through education and community programs.

Partners in hope and prayer

When any person is faced with the difficult and painful challenges of one's life journey, The Carmelites offer companionship, hope and a place to share faith. Along with our parishes, school chaplain service, and spirituality centre, the National Shrine of Our Lady of Mount Carmel offers members of our Carmelite family special Mass services throughout the year with opportunities to ask the Carmelites for their prayerful intercessions. Through this avenue people come together in prayer and to give thanks, to pray for healing and to remember loved ones.

"We have an important presence in the world."

Fr Pedro Amaral was born in 1985 in Lospalos, located in the eastern part of Timor-Leste. One of eight children, Pedro's father is a farmer as was his Mum who died in 2016, just two months before his ordination. Shaped by life-changing events, Pedro knew he wanted to become a priest and help the people of Timor-Leste.

"In 1999, I was finishing Year 7 when everything was burnt down after the vote for independence. School was held in the bushes. I had a rock as a chair and my knees as a desk.

Before joining the Carmelites, I had only gone to church a few times a year. I didn't know anything about them but since Year 12, I knew I wanted to be a priest. I did a test to join the Carmelite seminary. As soon as I passed, I was on a bus to Zumalai where the Carmelites had a small community.

Today, I am Parish Priest in Zumalai. I was previously Assistant Director of the Boarding House.

I want to thank our donors for supporting our younger Brothers who are still studying. Thank you for helping to pay for their schooling and education, because the future of the Carmelite Order is in their hands. We really do have an important presence in the world."

Elisa's dream was to guide tourists around her beautiful country, showcasing its diverse environment, rich heritage and cultural landmarks.

"I really like learning languages and being able to communicate with people from around the world. I love my country and I want to show it to visitors so they can experience how wonderful all the places are here."

For many young adults like Elisa, being able to stay in school can be nothing more than just a dream. With Timor-Leste being the poorest country in our region, poverty and the lack of a stable income can put an end to pursuing an education. When Elisa was very young her mother died. Soon after, her father moved to Indonesia leaving her to be raised by her grandparents, aunt and uncle.

The generous support of the Carmelite family provided Elisa with an invaluable scholarship to complete a five-year Tourism and Travel Management Course at Dili Institute of Technology.

Receiving the annual scholarship helped Elisa realise her dreams of becoming a tourist guide and showcasing the natural beauty of Timor-Leste to an international audience.

"I'm so grateful that I could study and have all these experiences. When I was in high school, I didn't know what I would do next, but now the Carmelites are supporting me and so I'm working hard for my future and for my country's future."

Life changes.

Has your Will changed too?

There are many times in life when a change of circumstances necessitates the updating of your Will. For peace of mind, many estate lawyers recommend that you review your Will every five years.

It is timely to review your Will if:

- A major life change has occurred in your family, such as the birth of a child or grandchild,
- · A beneficiary named in your Will passes away,
- · You marry or become separated or divorced,
- Your financial circumstances change significantly.

We know thinking about death and what will happen after we are gone is uncomfortable. But it is important. Take the time now and write or update your Will to ensure your wishes are fulfilled.



Frequently Asked Questions

How do I leave a gift to the Carmelites in my Will?

You can use the suggested wording on page 15 as a guide when speaking to your solicitor or trustee company.

You can contact us on 03 9690 8822 or at philanthropy@carmelites.org.au if you'd like your legacy to go to a specific area and we can provide you with correct wording.

How much does including a gift in my Will cost?

Writing or updating your Will isn't as expensive as you might think. Solicitors can provide estimates, but the cost will depend on how complex your personal affairs are. You can even complete your Will online now. Google 'create will online' to see the providers.

Do I have enough money to leave a gift in my Will?

You can support a cause you are passionate about and it does not impact your bank balance today. Many everyday Australians are choosing to include charitable gifts in their Wills. They know they can look after both their loved ones and the causes they cared about during their lifetime.

Can I add a gift to the Carmelites to my existing Will?

Yes – it's as simple as adding a codicil or an amendment. We recommend that you consult your legal advisor to assist you with this.

How will my gift be used?

Your generous gift will go to the area of most need at the time. You can contact us if you'd like your legacy gift to go to a specific area.

Should I tell you when I've included a gift in my Will?

You don't have to, but we'd love for you to let us know. This will allow us to welcome you as a member of the Carmel Care Circle. You can read more about this on page 16.

Choose the legacy that's right for you.

Residual legacy: What's left of your estate after all of your wishes have been carried out and expenses in finalising your estate have been met. Residual gifts allows you to take care of your loved ones and financial commitments first. They also adjust automatically to changes in the value of your estate and hold their value over time.

Pecuniary legacy: A specific monetary amount. While these gifts provide you with certainty, they can lose their value over time due to inflation.

Specific legacy: A specified item such as property or shares. Again, these gifts can provide certainty, but only if the asset isn't sold or disposed of before you pass away.

Every legacy we receive – no matter the size – is important and received with gratitude. Talk to your solicitor about the most appropriate gift for your circumstances.

A Legacy of Devotion

Our Carmelite family is made up of a wonderful tapestry of people who are committed to helping those in need. One member of our family not only dedicated her life to helping people in her community but has also gone on to make a life-changing impact, beyond her lifetime, for the people and communities we serve. This is Mary's story.

Mary lived most of her quiet and unassuming life in a home across the road from Our Lady of Mount Carmel, in Wentworthville, NSW. As her father was a Lay Carmelite, it was only natural that Mary would follow in his footsteps and also become a Lay Carmelite herself. She had been professed a Lay Carmelite for more than 50 years, first belonging to the Lay Carmelite Sydney community and then with the Lay Carmelite Wentworthville community.

Mary's faith led her to devote her life to help people in her community. She always listened with an open heart and guided them on their spiritual path in life. For her friend Carolyn, Mary was a person who led by example to the whole community.

Carolyn fondly remembers, "Mary's whole life was Carmel. She was very knowledgeable about everything Carmelite related and was the prior

of the Lay Carmelite Wentworthville community for 3 years. Mary's strength was being prayerful and private, devoted to her faith."

In November 2021, at the age of 95, Mary died. As she had helped so many during her lifetime, Mary made a lasting legacy which today is helping many more people in Australia and Timor-Leste.

Mary left a gift in her Will to the Carmelites. A gift that is today transforming lives by giving young people, including our Carmelite students, the opportunity to pursue an education and go on to create change in their communities.

We are most grateful for Mary's gift of a lifetime which will make a life-changing difference for so many into the future.
